1) Share "why and how to differentiate" to our colleague

It is a fact that our students will not be motivated if the materials are too hard or too easy. In fact, some students would completely shut down or feel a waste of time. At the same time, the practical ways for teachers to differentiate in the daily classroom is not that easy. Oftentimes, it involves more lesson plans and also creates management problems by a group of students who are not directly supervised. The solution is blended learning: to teach each unit by a structured sequence and also to implement technology for visible learnings.
